Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

We are looking forward to a great term and are enjoying settling back into the classroom learning environment. I hope students and families have had a well-earned break and are keeping well. With updated health advice and changes to State and National restrictions, schools have been able to recommence the majority of schoolbased activities from the start of Term 3.

The return to school means that all students should be learning on campus unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence. Please do not send your child to school if they are unwell, even if they have mild symptoms. Parents/Carers will be contacted and requested to pick their child up if they come to school unwell or become unwell whilst at school. Given the current COVID-19 environment, it is more important than ever for the school to have correct contact details on record. Accordingly, if your details or details of emergency contacts for your child have changed this year, please complete the attached form and return it to the Front Office.

All students and staff who have visited Victoria must have a NSW border entry pass and are required to selfisolate for a period of 14 days. This means that all students and staff who have visited Victoria in the 14 days before the start of school should not attend school until they complete the 14 days self-isolation period since they left Victoria.

BWSC Umina Campus is vigilant when implementing infection control, physical distancing and personal hygiene protocols to protect the health and safety of students and staff. We promote and follow good hygiene practices including:

- regularly washing hands
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from hydration stations around the school and not using bubblers directly.

The activities that are permitted at school will be conducted in a way that is safe and appropriate in the current environment. Those that remain on hold will be reviewed during the term and will recommence when appropriate, based on health and other relevant advice. Students and families will be advised of any changes that may occur and will be updated as information becomes available to us.
