

Brisbane Water Secondary College Wins Champion School Steer at Singleton Prime Stock Competition

Twenty two students represented Brisbane Water Secondary College (BWSC) competing successfully to the highest level in a very competitive and professional field at the Singleton Prime Stock Competition on 13th September.

Over one hundred head of cattle were entered representing nine schools and numerous professional






