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# Principal's Report



Term 3 is nearly at an end and I'd like to thank the staff, students, parents and the wider community for all their work this term.

The schools NAPLAN results were particularly impressive and the school has been identified as performing at a very high standard through the External Validation process. The performance of Year 7 and Year 9 students' in literacy from the NAPLAN examinations was very impressive with significant growth in student performance data. The performance of Year 7 students in numeracy was very pleasing, whilst the overall performance of our Aboriginal students was remarkable.

The campus will investigate the data further in Term 4- but initial investigation indicates that there will be a major push on Boys Education and numeracy in Year 9 in 2017. This will be supported by the appointment of Angela Cox as the College Head Teacher Secondary Studies to oversee these programs, as well as eLearning and student transition from the Middle School to the Senior Campus.

The campus is also in the process of permanently appointing both a PDHPE and Music teacher who will begin in Term 4. Furthermore a Youth Outreach Worker (working three and a half days a week) and a Family Referral Service Worker (working four days a week) will be employed to support students and families at the Umina Campus.

The 6<sup>th</sup> of September saw the official opening of the heavily renovated Aboriginal Resource Centre in the old farm building on Veron Road. This classroom, situated next to the Aboriginal Garden, is an amazing resource which can be utilised by all students to support learning in our beautiful natural environment. I'd like to thank AECG President and BWSC Umina teacher Talara Freeman for overseeing this event. I'd also like to thank the Year 9 Aboriginal Studies class for their impeccable organisation and staff members Morrie Goolagong, Paul Richardson and Tina Baynie for their finishing touches to make it such a wonderful launch.

This week the school oval upgrade will commence. This will mean that the oval will be out of bounds for all of Term 4- but it is envisaged that a much safer and fully irrigated playing field will be ready for use in 2017. I would like to thank staff, students and parents for their understanding as they overcome the inconvenience that will inevitably occur during its construction.

I would like to congratulate our students for their wonderful sporting achievements this term. Our U15 boys won the Grand Final of the Buckley Shield on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> September at Campbelltown Sports stadium. This prestigious final was played against Eagle Vale High School for the honour of being the best comprehensive government school Rugby League team in NSW for Under 14's. A great achievement and many thanks to super coaches Mr Crouch and Mr Shearer for their outstanding efforts.

Similarly our Girls Year 7 and 8 Netball team have also made the State Finals to be played at the Homebush Olympic Precinct on the 20<sup>th</sup> of September. These girls have already been crowned Central Coast and then Hunter champions, and will now move into a round robin of the best 8 teams in the state. This competition organised by Netball NSW and the Sydney Swifts will mean they are playing for the honour of being the best comprehensive government netball team in NSW for their age. Congratulations to wonder coach Mrs Hocking for all her hard work.



team performed admirably in their All School and Country Cup competitions. As part of their Targeted Sport Program they also played against Illawarra SHS, Farrer MAHS, Wallsend SC amongst others.

## Buckley Shield

Our Buckley Shield created history this year by winning the prestigious and historic Buckley Shield. We are the only Central Coast school since 1975 to win this event (we also won it in 2011). Late in term 1 the boys defeated 12 other Central Coast schools to enter into the final 20 in the state draw. They faced a handy Orange HS outfit from Western NSW in round 1, but were too strong for them winning 24-12. From there the team embarked on a series of gruelling road trips, playing far from home against some large and noisy crowds. Next up they travelled to Yanco HS from the Riverina region, earning a solid win. Another road trip to Kiama saw the boys hold a fast finishing South Coast team 46-38, earning a place in the semi finals against last years winners Merrylands HS. Here they encountered a large, physical team but great team work and belief in our rehearsed structures saw us secure a hard fought 24-18 win and book a place in the 'big dance' - the grand final at the home of the mighty Wests Tigers at Campbelltown Sport Stadium.

Again, the team trained really well and we knew we were in for another big and physical team in Eagle Vale HS from South Western Sydney. We got off to a slow start, making some uncharacteristic errors which led to us conceding the first try. From there the boys gradually improved, defending well and working to our strengths in attack. We led at half time 16-4. The team were desperate for victory and were prepared to work hard, be disciplined, play as a team, respect each other, their opposition and the referee, and persevere to earn themselves a famous victory. Final score was 24-16. We were fortunate to have a great group of supporters which really made it a memorable day for our great school. Man of the match was Jessi O'Neill, and captain Jamie Capell was a deserved winner of the Buckley Shield player of the competition award. 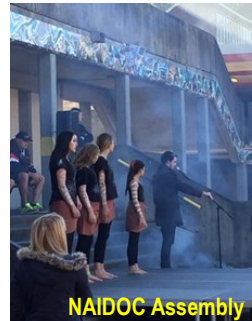

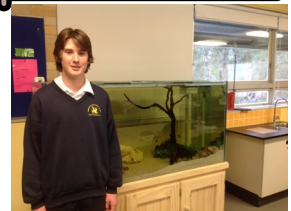

It is important that they make their own corrections and in their own time. They will then need to print their work off and have it ready for the day of their Interview.

I look forward to seeing the students on the day of their Mock Interview.

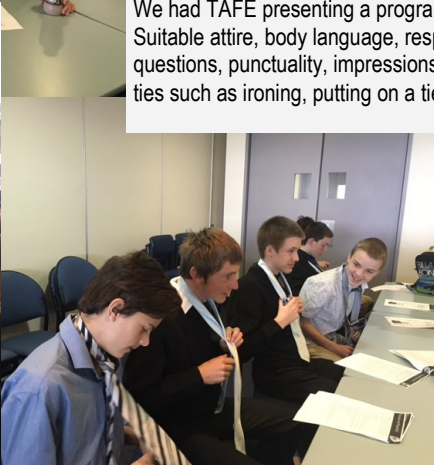

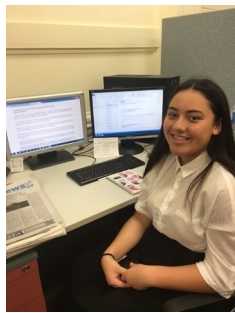


### Careers Workshop

This was a subsidised excursion where students spent some time learning some great tips for mock interviews...or the real thing.

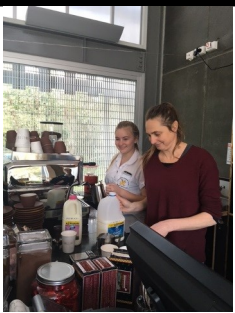

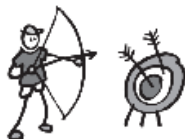
