

Message from the **Principal**

Term 2 is quickly drawing to a close and I would like to thank the staff for their wonderful work in preparing student reports. It has been a great term and I have been very impressed by our student achievements in a wide range of sporting, cultural and academic pursuits.

Brisbane Water Secondary College is currently undertaking an extensive 'student voice' initiative, with Deputy Principal Adam Montgomery, to ascertain how students like to learn and their thoughts on schooling at Brisbane Water Secondary College. This will form the basis of the next school plan for 2018 – 2020. Furthermore, College Principal Paul Gilmore will be gathering the thoughts of parents and teachers at the school and those from our partner primary schools. This information will then regularly reviewed as part of the 'BWSC Strategic Plan' for the next three years, as we endeavour to make our outstanding school even better by attempting to meet the specific needs of our community.

The campus has been the focus of much activity in recent times. This has included a visit from Deputy Secretary of the Department of Education Murat Dizdar and the University of Queensland to investigate the outstanding results of the school. A particular focus of these investigations was on increased student enrolments numbers, steady improvements in the NAPLAN examination, close relationships with our partner primary schools, middle schooling initiatives and very strong student engagement with school in the recent Tell Them from Me student survey results.

The campus has also been the focus of considerable professional learning hosting numerous regional events. These have included a three-day Positive Partnerships workshop, which aimed at supporting staff and families with Asperger's and Autistic students. The regional AECG was also hosted here on the inaugural "Sorry day" assembly. Finally, next term the campus will host the training for schools as we move towards NAPLAN online in the immediate future.

There have been some notable staffing changes including the appointment of Jake Shearer to the Mathematics Department effective January 2018. Jake has contributed positively to the school culture and has been heavily involved in the preparation of our very successful Rugby League sides. Unfortunately, the end of Term 2 will see the retirement of Margaret Robson our very popular Head Teacher Science who has taught at both the Woy Woy and Umina campuses since 1979. Margaret has been an enormous contributor to Public Education, being a published author of Biology textbooks and Supervisor of Marking for the Higher School Certificate. Her contribution to the education of those on the Peninsula and its surrounds cannot be understated. I wish Margy a very happy and restful retirement. She will be very sorely missed.

The school has had considerable success in a range of fields since the last newsletter. The Year 8 debating side has continued its string of successes with a strong victory over Gosford Selective High School. The cheerleading team are again NSW champions and along with some of our solo dancers will be heading to the National Champion on the Gold Coast in August. Our dancers have performed beautifully at both Star Struck in Newcastle and Central Coast Dance Festival at Laycock Street theatre. The school also participated in Bookfest with students attending 17 conferences with up to four classes attending at a time. Amazingly, we have 500 students on target to complete the Premiers Reading Challenging! Thank you to all our dedicated staff for providing these wonderful opportunities for our very talented students.

Overall, there are amazing programs and initiatives that are occurring across the College. Please promote the great work that is taking place and encourage parents who have historical doubts to contact me for a tour of the school. - Maths online


If you are concerned that your child is not completing homework, please let us know so we can follow up for you.




ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

Careers Corner

Year 9 have now entered 'google classroom' and are finishing off their resumes. Students have one last lesson to use their class time to finalise their work. If students require extra time, this project becomes homework. All resumes and cover letters must be submitted by August 14 for feedback.

These resumes, along with the cover letter, will be used for our schools Mock Interviews that are on November 20-22. Students have been told to start working on their portfolios and collating all school reports, certificates, awards outside of school and anything else relevant.

Unfortunately, our two prior Barista excursions were cancelled this year, due to low numbers. Our last Barista excursion will be on August 25. Money and permission note MUST be in by August 4 for it to proceed.

The White Card permission note and money must also be in by the last day of term 2, June 30. The excursion is planned for July 28.

I would just like to remind all parents and students that excursion notes along with money must now be in 15 school days prior to the excursion.

Year 8 have also been introduced to 'google classroom'. Students have been exploring career sites such as; JobJump and learning to type using a great site called typingclub.com.

I am also pleased to inform you that I was again successful in my application for additional funding for careers. We have received a School to Works Grant of \$4,000. This money will be used to expand on student's preparation for the upcoming Mock Interviews.

Lastly, I have had several local businesses approach me and ask me to source students for part time and casual work.
